

Adopt-A-Road Spring 2018

The Counties, Ontario – The Adopt-A-Road program is open to various groups of volunteers, families or neighbours to assist in providing a cleaner environment and a more scenic roadway, by collecting refuse and debris from the side of their “adopted” road.

It is an agreement with the United Counties of SDG for a two-year period and states that the parties involved are willing to pick up trash on a minimum length of 2 km on a County Road twice a year, usually in the spring and fall. SDG will erect a sign at each end of the adopted section with your group’s name on it. These signs will show motorists that you care about your community and the environment.

There is no cost to adopt a section of a County Road. The adoption process is simple and everyone is approved! Safety training, vests, gloves and garbage bags, along with any necessary support will be provided to ensure you are well prepared for the task.
